			6. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

			Dr. Singer shared 96% of 3 <sup>rd</sup> Grade students passed I-Read and 4% will be remediated. This is the same percentage as last year. We are estimated to receive a reimbursement of \$4,881.06 for the Summer School costs. Dr. Singer shared state funding information and projected cash flow of the general fund. She estimated the amount of the projected school funding from state funding at a loss of 13% in 2017 and by 2019 there could be a loss of 39% of school funding from 2016 funding levels. Dr. Singer indicated Title I calculators project a loss of \$20,000 for 2018 of Title 1 funds and in 2019 \$98,000 loss of funds. This year we received \$189,000 in 2017 for our Title 1 program. There are concerns of future funding losses because this directly support the academic instruction of our students. On a good note our enrollment is us 2% from February count. Dr. Singer stated the corporation has been very proactive in the approach to financial planning. She also stated HCS will participate in free water testing for lead.
